

- •What's there stance on healthcare topics?
- •What constituent stories do you have to share?







Legislative

The Who's My Legislator? service is an online tool where the public at-large can determine what legislators represent them. Users can enter their home address or use map based navigation to see their Virginia House and Senate representatives, as well as those in the U.S. House and Senate.

# Legislative Team

- Introduce yourself
- Assign roles
  - Team leader
  - Identify constituents
  - Talking points for bills
  - Constituent impact/ stories
  - Closer
  - Picture



### Before the Appointment Begins

- •Be on time, be prepared to wait and be flexible!
- •Depending on the group size, the appointment may be conducted in an office, hallway, side office, etc



# During the Meeting

- Offer business card(s)
- •The team leader introduces the team and gets the meeting started
- Identify the constituent
- •Move to talking points and stories. Keep the tone positive
- •If you don't know the answer to a question asked, let the legislator or staff member know that you can follow-up. Make a note for lobbyists to follow-up.
- Keep it "short and sweet"


#### After the Meeting

- Debrief with the legislative team
- •Send an email or handwritten letter to the legislator providing a summary of what was learned and thanking them for their time



# How to Look Up Bills

lis.virginia.gov



SB 833 – prohibits requirements of vaccination for education, employment, etc

VSHP likely to oppose this legislation

SB 793 – Prohibits the BOM from disciplinary action solely for prescribing/administering/dispensing hydroxychloroquine or ivermectin for COVID-19

We may need more discussion about actively opposing vs remaining neutral

HB 1409 – Provides that restrictions on the distribution of hypodermic needles and syringes not prohibit the dispensing of diabetic syringes and "insulin pens" by those authorized to dispense insulin for treatment of diabetes.

- Somewhat unclear intention of this bill. We do have concerns with the wording of "insulin pens" and believe it is meant to be "insulin pen needles" and not the drug itself
